

3rd Annual Eastern Canada District CKI Convention

The 3rd annual Eastern Canada District Convention came to a close on February 23, 2008. It was a marvelous event held in Fredericton New Brunswick, hosted by St. Thomas University and the University of New Brunswick in a joint partnership. Seven different universities from Eastern Canada were represented at the convention, namely: University of Ottawa, University of Toronto, Dalhousie University, Carleton University, University of New Brunswick, University of Waterloo, and St. Thomas University. Day 1

- A new tradition carried on from the 2007 Waterloo convention of playing musical chairs was done.
